THE FOLLOWING ACTIVITIES WILL BE AVAILABLE, WEATHER PERMITTING:

DAMAGE CONTROL SIMULATOR: Using the USCG damage control simulation trailer, Sea Scouts learn to manage damage and emergency situations onboard boats, including hull damage and sinking situations. Sea Scouts should be prepared to get wet, and bring at least one change of clothing.

DEWATERING PUMPS: Using teamwork, Sea Scouts will learn how to dewater a sinking vessel. Sea Scouts should be prepared to get wet, and bring at least one change of clothing.

PYROTECHNICS INSTRUCTION: Sea Scouts will learn the proper use of emergency flares, and their proper disposal.

FLASHPAN/FIRE EXTINGUISHER TRAINING: Sea Scouts will learn how to properly extinguish various types of fires using equipment usually found on board a vessel. Protective equipment will be provided.

COLD WATER PLUMBING: Sea Scouts will be challenged to assemble piping and fittings in a cold-water setting. Sea Scouts should be prepared to get wet, and bring at least one change of clothing.

RECREATIONAL VESSEL INSPECTION: Sea Scouts will learn how to properly inspect a recreational vessel for safety equipment.

FIRST AID: Sea Scouts will demonstrate first aid skills when responding to an emergency situation.

CRAFT IN DISTRESS EXERCISE: Sea Scouts will be challenged with locating a vessel in distress, and organize the search and rescue mission.

GENERAL INFORMATION

UNIFORMS Youth should wear Sea Scout working blues or other unit-specific working uniform. Expect to get wet? Bringing at least one complete change of clothing, including shoes, and plenty of towels is highly recommended. Jewelry such as necklaces, bracelets, and rings present a safety hazard at some of the stations, and therefore should not be worn.

Adults are requested to wear their uniforms.

COST The fee for each individual (youth and adult) attending this even will be **\$15.00**. This fee will cover food, training materials, and other event costs.

PARKING Parking is available inside of the station grounds. Note that *only registered attendees* will be permitted in the station.

DIRECTIONS Directions to the event are included with the registration materials.

OTHER INFORMATION

- All Sea Scout Ships must have approved tour permits. The permits must be displayed upon arrival at the check-in desk.
- All Sea Scout Ship Skippers/Mates are responsible for securing parental/guardian permission slips for each youth participant. Event leadership will not be responsible for obtaining or checking permission slip forms. An example form is attached to the registration materials.
- BSA's rules under "Guide to Safe Scouting" will be enforced
- Adults are responsible for monitoring the behavior of their Sea Scouts
- Sea Scouts should act like Scouts ("A Scout is courteous") and leave all areas better than they find them.
- The USCG Station Sandy Hook is an active military base, and all visitors should act accordingly.
- Registration must include the names of ALL participating persons. For security reasons, individuals that are not pre-registered WILL NOT be permitted on station grounds.
